Call For Abstracts: Oral Presentations

Participants are encouraged to submit abstracts regarding clinical, basic science, and psychosocial aspects of hereditary colorectal cancer. We are interested in abstracts for both established projects with data to share and newly-started projects. Our goal is to provide a comprehensive update on the status of clinical research and to stimulate collaborations, recruitment of subjects, and ideas for the development of other studies.

All abstracts should contain the following information:

Title: Bolded.

Authors: Italics, with each author listed by full first name, surname, institutional affiliation, city, state/province.

Presenting Author: Underlined.

Formatting: Abstracts should be single-spaced, one page, with one-inch margins, and a font size of 12.

Copyright and Disclosure: Abstracts must not contain copyrighted material. Please include disclosure of funding at the end of the abstract.

Submission Deadline: August 1, 2005. Acceptance of abstracts will be acknowledged by email. Authors will be notified on September 1, 2005. All communication will be with submitting author only.

Posters: Poster board dimensions are four (4) feet across by four (4) feet high. Velcro adhesives ONLY will be permitted and will be provided by the meeting.

Continuing Education Information

- Explain new screening, surgical, and research options available to high risk patients.
- Discuss the role of genetic counseling and hereditary colorectal cancer registries in the care of individuals and families affected by these syndromes.

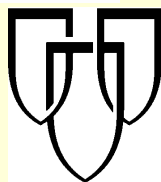
